INTERNATIONAL NURSES DAY-2025

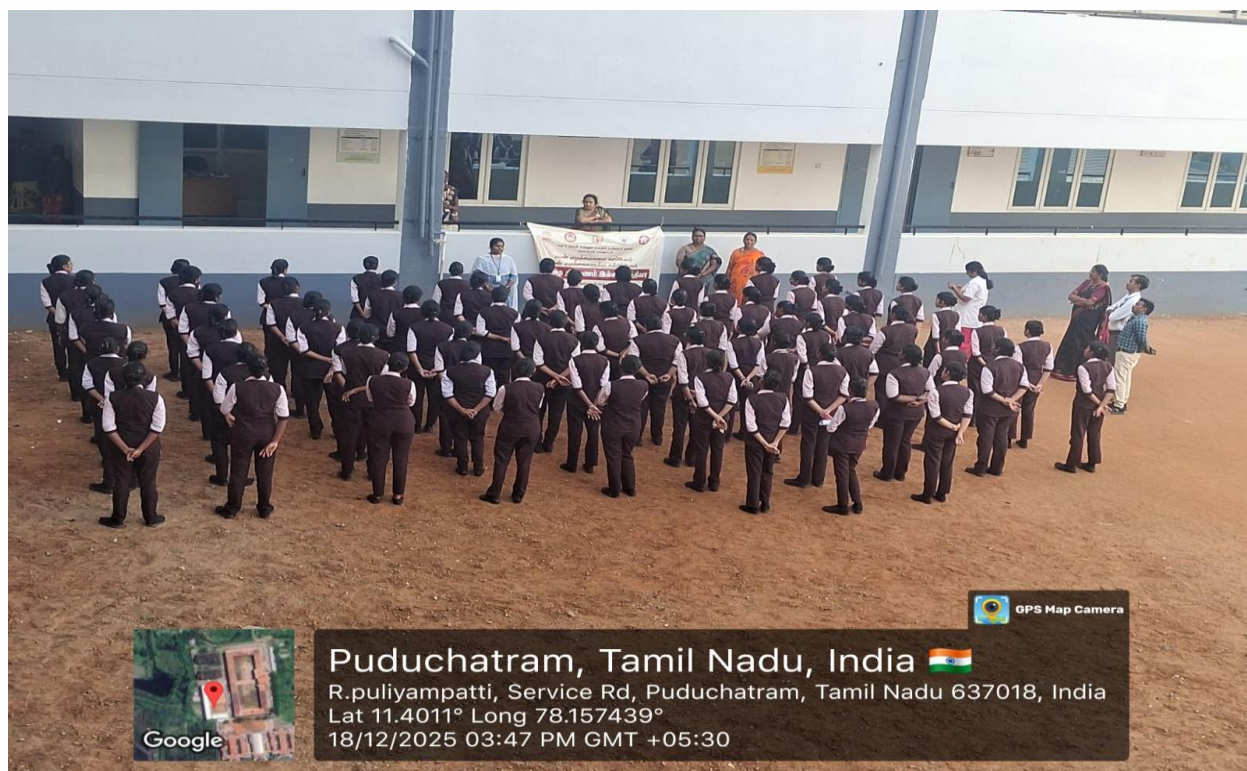
WORLD AIDS DAY AWARENESS RALLY - 2025

WORLD LEPROSY DAY 2026
